I, Richard K. Beggs, the mayor of the City of Clintonville, declare as follows:

**I. Findings:**


1. An emergency as defined by municipal code 1.09(4) has previously been declared by the mayor of the city of Clintonville.
2. The mayor, pursuant to section 1.09(2) may promulgate orders, rules and regulations relating to the conduct of persons as are necessary to protect the public health and safety.
3. It is in the necessary interest of the city, its employees and elected officials that in person contact be minimized to the extent possible, and the city is obligated to utilize technology to facility the protection of the health and safety of the above named persons.
4. The city has not adopted regulations fully necessary to address the current emergency, which requires social isolation and distancing, specifically methods of voting by council members.

**II. Order:** Based upon the above, and the authority vested in me by section 1.09(2), I promulgate the following order:

Effective immediately, teleconferencing and/or videoconferencing shall be deemed to be in person voting by city council members. All council members shall vote and appear at all meetings by teleconferencing and/or videoconferencing.


This determination shall remain in effect until rescinded by the Mayor.
